

The effects of the pandemic continue to impact our staff.


Staff shortages continue as we have sick staff in the flu season and protocols to stay home from work when sick.

We continue to trust God to provide staff for the Menno Place Team who love their jobs and experience their work as meaningful ministry to the vulnerable.


